Figure 1 Alachua County Sheriff's Office statistics. Note that there will be overlaps. I.e., if a gun was stolen during a vehicle burglary, there will be tallies under burglaries and under stolen firearms. Shots fired includes calls that resulted in a written report. Suicide numbers are subject to change, since it may take time for a death to be ruled a suicide.

## **Program Updates**

IMPACT GNV is hiring an intervention specialist for the B.O.L.D. program, planning crisis intervention de-escalation trainings, and applications for the Youth Services Steering Committee are open.

<u>BeSMART</u> gave a presentation on their efforts to educate the public on securing guns to prevent gun-related deaths. SMART: **S**ecure all guns in your home and vehicles, **M**odel responsible behavior around guns, **A**sk about the presence of unsecured guns in other homes, **R**ecognize the role of guns in suicide, and **T**ell your peers to be SMART.

## **Current Alliance Efforts**

We're in the process of finalizing the Requests for Proposals and hope to share the proposals at the next alliance meeting. We shared our proposal for Children's Trust of Alachua County (CTAC) funding for the 2024-2025 fiscal year and requested feedback from the stakeholders in time to finalize the proposal and submit it to the CTAC board.
